Please refer to the Office Memorandum F.No.12-4/2019-U1 dated  $17^{th}$  January, 2019 issued by the Government of India for implementing the  $103^{rd}$  Constitutional Amendment (Copy enclosed).

Operational portion of the said Notification is extracted:

If the State Government/UT has a reservation policy for admission in teacher education institutes and the same is applicable to Private and Self-financing Teacher Education institutions, then the State Government/UT shall ensure that 10% of Reservation for EWS would be operational from the Academic year 2019-20 without affecting the percentage reservations of SC/ST/OBC/General. However, this would not be applicable in the case of Minority institutions referred to the clause (1) of Article 30 of Constitution of India.

#### OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject: Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) for admission in Central Educational Institutions.

In accordance with the provisions of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment). Act 2019, and the reference of Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment vide OM No. 20013/01/2016-BC-II dated 17th January 2018 ienabling prevision of reservation for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes, it has been decided to provide reservation in admission to educational institutions subject to a maximum of ten per cent of the total seats in each category. This would not apply to the minerity educational institutions referred to in clause (1) of Article 30 of the Constitution of India.

2. The provision of reservations to the Economically Weaker Sections shall be in accordance with the directions contained in the OM: No. 320016/01/2016 BC-II dated 17th January 2019 of the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment and shall be subject to the following:

a) The reservations shall be provided to EWSs for admission in Central Educational Institutions, (as defined in clause (d) of section (2) of The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006) from the academic year 2019.

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b) The above reservation would not be applicable to the 8 institutions of excellence, research institutions, institutions of national & strategic linportance as specified in the Schedule to The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006, as amended from time to time, and appended to this OM, and to the minority jeducational institutions referred to in clause (1) of article 30 of the Constitution.

c) Every Central Educational Institution shall, with the prior approval of the appropriate authority (as defined in clause (c) of section 2 of The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006), increase the number of seats over and above its annual permitted strength in each branch of

study or faculty so that the number of seats available, excluding those reserved for the persons belonging to the EVVSs, is not less than the number of such seate available, in each category, for the academic session immediately preceding the date of the coming into force of this O.M.

- Where, on a representation by any Central Educational Institution, the appropriate authority is satisfied that for teasons of financial physical or academic limitations or in order to maintain the standards of education, the annual permitted strength in any branch of study or faculty of such institution cannot be increased for the academic session following the commencement of this Act, it may permit such institution to increase the annual permitted strength over a maximum period of two years beginning with the academic session over a maximum pendo of two years pagitining with the academic session following the commencement of this Act; and then, the extent of tessevation for the Economically Weaker Sections shall be limited for that academic session in Such manner that the number of seats made available to the Economically Weaker Sections for each academic session shall not requestive number and the percentage of reservations provided for SC/ST/OBC dategories.
- e) The scheme for implementing the reservation for the EWS shall be displayed on the website of the institution as soon as possible, but no later than 31st March
- The Chairman UGC, Chairman AICTE and Chairperson NCTE and the Bureau Heads of the Department of fligher Education in the Ministry of Human Resource Development responsible for management of the Institutions of National Importance are requested to ensure immediate compliance of this OM.

The following Act of Parliament received the assent of the President on the 12th January, 2019, and is hereby published for general information:—

## THE CONSTITUTION (ONE HUNDRED AND THIRD AMENDMENT) ACT, 2019

[12th January, 2019.]

An Act further to amend the Constitution of India.

BE it enacted by Parliament in the Sixty-ninth Year of the Republic of India as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be called the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019.

Short title and commencement.

- (2) It shall come into force on such date as the Central Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, appoint.
- 2. In article 15 of the Constitution, after clause (5), the following clause shall be inserted, namely:-

Amendment of article 15.

- '(6) Nothing in this article or sub-clause (g) of clause (1) of article 19 or clause (2) of article 29 shall prevent the State from making,-
  - (a) any special provision for the advancement of any economically weaker sections of citizens other than the classes mentioned in clauses (4) and (5); and
  - (b) any special provision for the advancement of any economically weaker sections of citizens other than the classes mentioned in clauses (4) and (5) in so

far as such special provisions relate to their admission to educational institutions [PART II—SEC. 1] including private educational institutions, whether aided or unaided by the State, other than the minority educational institutions referred to in clause (1) of article 30, which in the case of reservation would be in addition to the existing reservations and subject to a maximum of ten per cent. of the total seats in each

Explanation.—For the purposes of this article and article 16, "economically weaker sections" shall be such as may be notified by the State from time to time on the basis of family income and other indicators of economic disadvantage.

Amendment of article 16.

- 3. In article 16 of the Constitution, after clause (5), the following clause shall be inserted, namely:-
  - "(6) Nothing in this article shall prevent the State from making any provision for the reservation of appointments or posts in favour of any economically weaker sections of citizens other than the classes mentioned in clause (4), in addition to the existing reservation and subject to a maximum of ten per cent. of the posts in each

## Subject: Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) in civil posts and services in the Government of India and admission in

In pursuance of insertion of clauses 15(6) and 16(6) in the Constitution vide the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019 and in order to enable the Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes, to receive the benefits of reservation on a preferential basis in civil posts and services in the Government of India and admission in Educational Institutions, it has been decided by the Government to provide 10% reservation to EWSs in civil posts and services in Government of India and admission in Educational Institutions.

- Persons who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for 2. the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes and whose family has gross annual income below Rs. 8.00 lakh are to be identified as EWSs for the benefit of reservation. Family for this purpose will include the person who seeks benefit of reservation, his/her parents and siblings below the age of 18 years as also his/her spouse and children below the age of 18 years. The income shall include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession etc. and it will be income for the financial year prior to the year of application. Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWSs, irrespective of the family income:
  - 5 acres of Agricultural Land and above;
  - ii. Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
  - iii. Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;

- iv. Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the
- The income and assets of the families as mentioned in para 2 would be required to be certified by an officer not below the rank of Tehsildar in the States/UTs. The officer who issues the certificate would do the same after carefully verifying all relevant documents following due process as prescribed by the respective State/UT.
- Every Educational Institution shall, with the prior approval of the appropriate authority, increase the number of seats over and above its annual permitted strength in each branch of study or faculty so that the number of seats available, excluding those reserved for the persons belonging to the EWSs, are not less than the total seats available in the academic session immediately preceding
- Instructions regarding reservation in employment and admission to educational institutions will be issued by DoPT and Ministry of HRD respectively.
